KEN MALLOY is a graduate of the University of Houston, and a Registered Professional Engineer, currently employed at Mohr Engineering, a Division of Stress Engineering Services in Houston; where he is often asked to explore the causes for operational and equipment failures on behalf of operators, contractors, and manufacturers. Prior to Mohr Engineering, Ken was a consulting drilling engineer where his travels took him to Ecuador, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, and China.

He is also an active member of the American Association of Drilling Engineers (Houston Chapter), the Society of Petroleum Engineers, and the American Petroleum Institute; where he is Chairman of the Work Group studying how hardband material affects casing wear. Ken has a long standing interest in Managed Pressure Drilling and Underbalanced Operations with particular attention to safe drilling operations and efficiency, wellbore stability, and well control. He is a member of the International Association of Drilling Contractors' Underbalanced Operations and Managed Pressure Drilling Committee.

Ken is Co-Investigator and the Project Manager for Joint Industry Project DEA155, a Risk Assessment Study of Managed Pressure Drilling. (his talk is on this JIP)

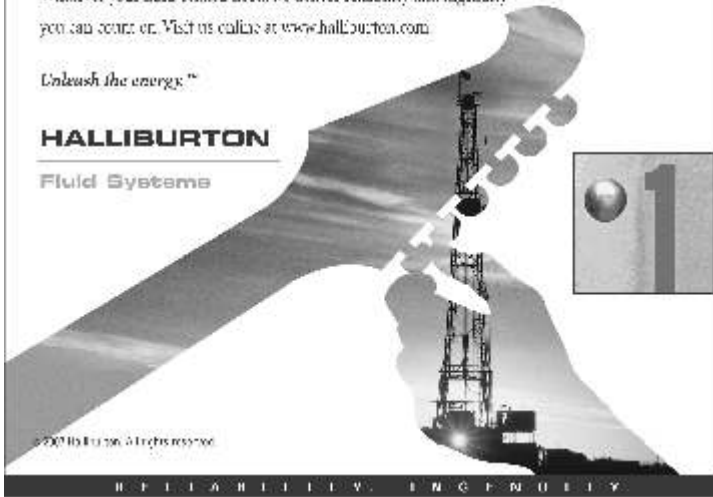
